Pre-ETS Coordinator What makes us the "Experts Where Disability & Employment Meet"?







Answer: Pre-ETS services offered after-school, on weekends, or during the summer!

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Facts about Disability & Employment:

- The Workforce Participation Rate of Adults with Disabilities
 - 21.5% versus 68.4% for Adults without Disabilities (includes those employed and unemployed actively seeking work) (Department of Labor, Office of Disability Employment Policy, March 2018)
 - Only 55.1 percent of young adults with Autism held paying jobs during their first six years out of high school, the lowest percentage among the disability categories examined. (Shattuck, 2012)
- Many people with disabilities are in low wage jobs that perpetuate their dependence on the government and their family members. This is particularly devastating for high-functioning individuals with higher earning potential. (Carley, 2016)

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What is WIOA & Pre-ETS?

What is WIOA?

- The Workforce Innovation and Ospatrunity Act (WIOA) amends the Behabilitation Act of 1973 and requires vaccinand rehabilitation (Wio galancies to sat addre effects) and their depart functs to provide "pre-employment transition services" to "Students with Disabilities who are eligible or "potentially eigible" for VEservices."
- What is Pre-ETS?
- Pre-ETS is the abbreviation for Pre-Employment Transition Services. These services include five required domains designed to prepare students with disabilities, currently in school, for work.
- Five required domains are:
- Job Exploration Courseling
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 Work-Based Learning Experiences
 Courseling on Post-Secondary Opportunities
 Workplace Readiness Training
- Self-Advocacy
 To qualify students must be...
- Ages 14 to 22

- Ages 14 0.2 x
 Broiled in secondary or post-secondary education
 Receiving Special Education or S04 Services due to a diagnosed disability
 Did you know there is an MOU between TEA and TWC-VR to encourage collaboration to provide PreEff services to subdents?

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Challenges to Providing Pre-ETS:

- In a state the size of Texas, one provider, agency, or school simply can't do enough by themselves to reach all of the districts, schools, and students that need to be served.
- Challenges for Schools:
 - Lack of funding, staff capacity, and/or time/bandwidth Lack of access to high-quality curriculum
 - In some cases, a lack of support or understanding from administrators
- Challenges for Providers:
 - Limitations of summer and after school student/staff/space availability
 Lack of affordable space

 - Reimbursement-based model resulting in delays of up to 90 days for payment
- Challenges for VR:
 - High staff tumover
 - Overwhelmed by large schools and caseloads Lack of time to actually do direct service
